| Greater Los Angeles Zoo Association (GLAZA) | 1963 | \$60 Million | Created to support the Los Angeles Zoo in its mission to nurture wildlife and enrich the human experience. GLAZA's primary responsibility is to seek and provide financial support for the Zoo's programs and capital projects. |
| Library Foundation of Los Angeles | 1992 | \$80 Million | Partners with all 73 Los Angeles Public Libraries to enhance the resources and services offered to Angelenos. Working to complement the City's responsibility to fund the Los Angeles Public Library, the Foundation has raised over \$80 million for the Public Library. From funding literacy programs to equipping libraries with the latest technology, we are dedicated to keeping the library open and thriving for generations to come. |
| Los Angeles Police Foundation | 1998 | \$18 Million | Major source of private financial support for the LAPD. The Police Foundation supports the LAPD by creating partnerships that provide resources to fund urgently needed equipment and technology, training, youth programs and community outreach not available from the city budget. |
| Los Angeles Fire Foundation | 2010 | | To support needs not met by the city budget. Approximately 96% of the budget pays for salaries and benefits, leaving very little for the other needs of the department. |
| Department of Cultural Affairs est 1925 | 1980 | Since 2007-2008 \$23 Million estimate \$5 per year | Generates and supports high quality arts and cultural experiences for Los Angeles' 4 million residents and 40 million annual overnight and day visitors. DCA advances the social and economic impact of the arts and ensures access to diverse and enriching cultural activities through: grantmaking, marketing, public art, community arts programming, arts education, and building partnerships with artists and arts and cultural organizations in neighborhoods throughout the City of Los Angeles. |
| LA PARKS FOUNDATION | 2008 | \$8 Million | The Foundation provides support that the City of Los Angeles is unable to offer by raising funds to improve park facilities, enhance park environments, preserve and restore historic elements in our city parks, support sustainability projects and purchase property for future parkland |
| LA Animal Services Animal Welfare & Spay/Neuter Trust Funds | 1987 | \$1 Million Annually | To promote and protect the health, safety and welfare of both animals and people in the City of Los Angeles. |
| Project Restore | 1986 | | To recapture the splendor of the Public Works Session Room in Los Angeles City Hall by replicating the original wooden pews which had been removed. With the completion of the restorations of Los Angeles City Hall and the Valley Municipal Building, this organization remains dedicated to the restoration and maintenance of valuable city buildings, preserving these landmarks in order to maintain the culture and history that reside within them. |
| Griffith Observatory (FOTO) | 1978 | \$30 Million | To support Griffith Observatory and its mission of being a vital community and international centerpiece of learning, discovery and inspiration about astronomy. FOTO aims to Inspire the Future, One Imagination at a Time. |
