The donation is for the purchase of two Explosive Detection Vapor Wake Canines and corresponding training for two canine handlers at the Auburn University Canine Detection Training Center. The Vapor canines are standard explosive detection canines with additional capabilities and training to detect carried or body worn explosives. The Vapor Wake canines are trained to detect the plume of air coming off a person and/or what he or she is carrying as the person passes through a check point or within a crowd. The canines can also detect explosives vapor wake, after a person has traveled through an area, and can follow the vapor wake to the explosive source. These canines are well suited to track persons carrying explosives in large crowd environments.

No expressed or implied commitments or promises were made to the donor or representatives of the donor. The donor will not receive any preferential treatment, endorsement, or recommendation; and the donor is not allowed the use of any Los Angeles Police Department patents.




