SUBJECT: TRANSMITTAL OF THE GRANT AWARD ACCEPTANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-14 POLICE GRANT FUNDS – POST-RELEASE SUPERVISED PERSONS PROGRAM

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE this report.
2. That the Board TRANSMIT the grant award for the 2013-14 Police Grant Funds – Post-Release Supervised Persons Program (PSP Program), pursuant to Administrative Code Section 14.6(a), to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst, and to the City Clerk for Committee and City Council consideration.
3. That the Board REQUEST the Mayor and City Council to:
 - A. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police or designee to ACCEPT the award of the 2013-14 PSP Program funds in the amount of \$2,607,242.50 from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) through the City of Gardena, for the period of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015;
 - B. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police or designee to negotiate and execute the award agreement and submit any necessary documents relative to the grant award, subject to City Attorney approval as to form and legality;
 - C. AUTHORIZE the Controller to set up a grant receivable in the amount of \$2,607,242.50 and establish an appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, for the disbursements of PSP Program grant funds;
 - D. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in Fund No. 339, Department No. 70;
 - E. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to spend up to grant amount of \$2,607,242.50 in accordance with the grant award agreement;

- F. INSTRUCT the City Clerk to place on the Council agenda on July 1, 2014, or the first meeting day thereafter the following instruction:

AUTHORIZE the Controller to increase appropriations as needed from Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, of the PSP Program appropriation account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100, Department No. 70, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001092	Overtime, Sworn	\$2,107,242.50
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- G. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and AUTHORIZE and INSTRUCT the Controller to implement the instructions.

DISCUSSION

The Los Angeles County Police Chiefs Association (LACPCA) received \$7.7 million in funds from the State of California BSCC to enable front-line intervention services for PSPs. Based on a collective decision from the members of the LACPCA, each local law enforcement agency was allocated funds based on the current PSP population in their city.

The City of Los Angeles has approximately 33 percent of the entire PSP population in Los Angeles County. Currently, this population totals 4,313 PSPs. Based on these figures, the LACPCA has allocated \$2,607,242.50 to the Department. This is the second year of funding for the Department. The LAPD has earmarked \$500,000 for technology to streamline integration of offender information with Smart Justice. The remaining balance (\$2.1 million) will pay for sworn overtime, which will be used for additional intervention services, specifically compliance checks involving PSPs, as well as efforts to locate absconders.


