## MOTION

## HOUSING

The Housing and Community Investment Department (HCID) initiated the Permanent Supportive Housing Program in 2007. Since its inception, 1,910 units of housing has been set aside for homeless persons, half of which are for the chronically homeless. Additionally, 262 units have been set aside for homeless veterans, with plans to set aside another 290 units. With thousands of homeless individuals continuing to sleep on the streets every night in Los Angeles, the Council should receive an update from HCID on the current state of the Permanent Supportive Housing Program, including ways the City can incentivize the creation of more units.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council instruct the Housing and Community Investment Department (HCID) to provide a status report on the Permanent Supportive Housing Program and include the following:

- 1. The number of constructed units including the number occupied and the number vacant;
- 2. The number of units in the pipeline including timelines for completion; and
- 3. A map and chart organized by Council District showing the location of Permanent Supportive Housing buildings.

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Council instruct HCID to provide recommendations on what incentives can be provided to encourage the construction of additional Permanent Supportive Housing units.
