

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Administrative Citation Enforcement (ACE) Program quarterly report.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. APPROVE inclusion within the ACE Program the Bureau of Street Services.
2. REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present a draft ordinance to amend Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 11.2.10(a) and (b) to modify the time and manner in which judicial review of an Administrative Order must be sought pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6.
3. REQUEST the City Attorney to include in future quarterly reports any LAMC sections added during the reporting period.
4. REQUEST the City Attorney to report on:
  - a. Compiling ACE information on quarterly reports by Council District.
  - b. The initiation process for ACE program requests.
  - c. Options for community patrols to issue warning citations as an additional method to address quality of life issues.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the City Attorney. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

#### SUMMARY

At the meeting held on November 1, 2016, your Public Safety Committee considered the City Attorney's ACE Program quarterly report. The City Attorney reports that on June 21, 2013, the Council adopted the ACE Program Ordinance (Council file No. 10-0085), and requested that the City Attorney's Office develop an ACE Pilot Program involving the Los Angeles Police Department and the Department of Animal Services. On November 5, 2014, the Council adopted an implementation plan for the pilot program and, as part of that plan, requested the City Attorney to report back on a quarterly basis on the status of the program. The City Attorney's report dated September 8, 2016, attached to the Council file, provides the most recent update as to the program and recommends the addition of the Bureau of Street Services to the pilot program and a request for amendments to the ACE Ordinance. After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations of the ACE Program quarterly report as modified, as detailed above.

This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
