

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT and ORDINANCE FIRST CONSIDERATION relative to authorizing the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to allow other City agencies to install or remove any temporary no parking sign.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. PRESENT and ADOPT the accompanying ORDINANCE dated November 3, 2014, amending Subsection (e) of Section 80.07 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to allow the LADOT to delegate its authority to another City agency to install or remove temporary no parking signs.
2. RECEIVE and FILE Ordinance dated September 24, 2014, rendered moot by the approval of the above Ordinance.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the City Attorney. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

SUMMARY

Accompanying a report to Council dated November 3, 2014 (attached to the Council file), the City Attorney presents Ordinance dated November 3, 2014. The City Attorney reports that the LAMC authorizes LADOT to install, place, maintain, or remove any traffic control device or other type of sign in the City of Los Angeles. The accompanying Ordinance will authorize LADOT to allow other City departments, officers, or boards, and private agencies and persons to install, place, maintain, or remove any traffic control device or other type of sign. The November 3, 2014, Ordinance replaces the Ordinance dated September 24, 2014 (attached to the Council file).

At its meeting held November 12, 2014, the Transportation Committee discussed this matter with LADOT staff. Department staff stated that meetings have been held with film industry representatives to discuss film crews removing no parking signs after a film shoot has been completed. Film industry representatives have expressed a desire to remove the signs as soon as possible to lessen the impact of film shoot parking restrictions on communities. LADOT prefers to limit public handling of parking signs. The Department will continue to meet with the film industry to discuss this issue. The Committee recommended that Council approve the Ordinance dated November 3, 2014, and receive and file the Ordinance dated September 24, 2014.
