Summary:

The Historic Highland Park Neighborhood Council (HHPNC) supports the motion (14-1738-S2), with amendment. The motion seeks to explore the availability of Federal funding to supply all Los Angeles police officers with Body-Worn Video Cameras. While we do think increased oversight is a worthwhile pursuit, we would note that the 7,000 existing Body-Worn Video Cameras were not sufficient to prevent violence by police officers during the recent civil unrest. We would like to see an amendment to the motion requesting a report from the LAPD on rates of compliance with the existing BWVC use policies, rates of footage review, and whether additional policies need to be drafted to ensure proper use of this equipment.
