

RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS, AND NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to establishing the City's position regarding Proposition 62, the Justice Works Act of 2016.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Cedillo - Bonin), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2015-16 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for Proposition 62, the Justice Works Act of 2016, which would repeal the death penalty in the State of California, and replace it with a sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY


At a special meeting held on October 21, 2016, the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee considered Resolution (Cedillo - Bonin) and a report from the CLA relative to establishing the City's position regarding Proposition 62, the Justice Works Act of 2016, which would repeal the death penalty in the State of California, and replace it with a sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. The CLA report attached to the Council file provides additional background information and a summary of the Resolution.

Representatives of the CLA addressed the Committee, provided a brief overview of the matter, and responded to related questions.
