

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to prohibit the parking of vehicles for private sale with a For Sale sign on the east and west sides of Normandie Avenue from Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard to the I-10 Freeway.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Harris-Dawson - Buscaino):

REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present an Ordinance to amend LAMC Section 87.55, which established regulations for the parking of vehicles for private sale on certain City streets of public lands, to prohibit the parking of such vehicles with a For Sale sign on the east and west sides of Normandie Avenue from Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard to the I-10 Freeway.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On February 10, 2016, your Committee considered a Motion (Harris-Dawson - Buscaino) relative to amending LAMC Section 87.55, which established regulations for the parking of vehicles for private sale on certain City streets of public lands, to prohibit the parking of such vehicles with a For Sale sign on the east and west sides of Normandie Avenue from Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard to the I-10 Freeway. According to the Motion, on April 5, 2011, Council approved the addition of Section 87.55 to Chapter VIII of the LAMC that establishes regulations for the parking of vehicles displaying a "For Sale" sign or placard advertising the private sale of that vehicle.

LAMC Section 87.55 allows the City Council to amend this Section, after conducting a public hearing to include additional streets or public lands. The critical shortage of on-street parking along a segment of Normandie Avenue is exacerbated by people parking vehicles for the sole purpose of displaying them for private sale. The congregation of these vehicles is also creating vehicular and pedestrian traffic hazards and traffic congestion along this street.

After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Motion as detailed in the above recommendation. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
