MOTION

Los Angeles County (County) is undertaking intersection improvement projects located at 223rd Street and Normandie Avenue, and Lomita Boulevard and Vermont Avenue, portions of which are located in the City of Los Angeles (City). The intersection improvements have an estimated value of \$380,000 and are a significant benefit to the surrounding communities and the City of Los Angeles.

The improvements at 223rd Street and Normandie Avenue include the installation of east and west bound left turn signal phasing and curb ramps at all four corners, two of which are in the City. The improvements at Lomita Boulevard and Vermont Avenue include the installation of double left turn pockets for east bound traffic on Lomita Boulevard. This work requires signal improvements. The improvements will provide substantial congestion mitigation and be of particular benefit to the nearby Meyler Street Elementary School.

In consideration of the value of the improvements, the County is requesting that the City limit any permit fees associated with the installation of the improvements to a maximum of \$2,000. Given the considerable benefits of the proposed improvements to City residents and surrounding communities, it is appropriate to recognize the County's request.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Department of Public Works be authorized to limit any permit fees to a total amount of \$2,000 for work to be performed by Los Angeles County, or its contractors, for intersection improvements at the following locations: 223rd Street and Normandie Avenue, and Lomita Boulevard and Vermont Avenue.
