SUBSTITUTE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles City Council, by Ordinance No. 157,425, effective March 18, 1983, provided for the establishment of Preferential Parking Districts by Resolution of the Council in each case, under Section 80.58 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, on April 18, 1983, the City Council approved the Resolution (82-1283-S1) establishing Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 7 in an area of West Los Angeles bounded by Wilshire Boulevard, South Fairfax Avenue, West Olympic Boulevard and the Beverly Hills City limit with several parking restrictions; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, a new 290,000-square-foot motion picture museum will open in the historic Wilshire May Company building at Wilshire Boulevard and Fairfax, bringing one million visitors annually that will impact on-street parking for the surrounding residents; and

WHEREAS, the new museum is located immediately adjacent to PPD No. 7 and the residents are in need of greater protection from neighborhood intrusion that is expected from museum patrons;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58, amend Preferential Parking District No. 7 to authorize the use of a new "No Parking Anytime; **Vehicles with District No. 7 Permits Exempted**" restriction for installation on the following streets if valid petitions are received by the Department of Transportation requesting the installation or requesting a switch from less restrictive restrictions currently posted:

- Warner Drive between San Vicente Boulevard and South Fairfax Avenue
- Del Valle Drive between McCarthy Vista and South Fairfax Avenue
- Barrows Drive between San Vicente Boulevard and South Fairfax Avenue
- McCarthy Vista between San Vicente Boulevard and Wilshire Boulevard

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Preferential Parking District No. 7 remain unchanged.
