

PUBLIC WORKS AND GANG REDUCTION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to naming the intersection at 9th and Los Angeles Street as Stanley Hirsh Square.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Huizar – Koretz):

1. APPROVE the naming of the intersection at 9th and Los Angeles Street as Stanley Hirsh Square.
2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation to erect permanent ceremonial sign(s) to this effect at this location.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

On December 8, 2015, Council considered Motion (Huizar – Koretz) relative to naming the intersection at 9th and Los Angeles Street as Stanley Hirsh Square. Motion states that Mr. Hirsch, one of the forefathers of Downtown Los Angeles, was a philanthropist, real estate investor, and garment manufacturer. As renowned for his blunt-spoken style as his contributions to the Jewish community and the City of Los Angeles, Mr. Hirsh's impact on the Fashion District and Downtown is exemplary. In recognition of his embodiment of the American Dream and his service and contributions to Downtown and the City of Los Angeles, Motion movers recommend that the City honor his memory by naming the intersection of 9th and Los Angeles Street as Stanley Hirsh Square. Council referred Motion to the Public Works and Gang Reduction Committee for consideration.

At its meeting held January 25, 2016, the Public Works and Gang Reduction Committee recommended that Council approve Motion's instructions relative to this matter.
