PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Los Angeles Police Department's (LAPD) Revolving Training Fund (RTF) for Fiscal Year 2016-17.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. APPROVE the distribution of funds for the LAPD's RTF for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 in the amount of \$1.5 million dollars.
2. AUTHORIZE the distribution of the funds as follows:

Executive Development:	\$246,000
Professional Development:	1,004,000
Tuition Reimbursement:	<u>250,000</u>
Total:	\$1,500,000

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Board of Police Commissioners. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on August 16, 2016, your Public Safety Committee considered a Board of Police Commissioners report relative to the to the LAPD's RTF for Fiscal Year 2016-17. The Board of Police Commissioners reports that the LAPD is anticipating approximately \$1.5 million dollars to be available for the Revolving Training Fund for Fiscal Year 2016-2017. The LAPD is requesting that the \$246,000 be deposited in to the Executive Development account, \$1,004,000 into Professional Development, and 250,000 into Tuition Reimbursement. The Board of Police Commissioners provides the following descriptions in their report of the categories:

Executive Development: This category of disbursements includes courses and programs geared for executive or upper-management personnel. This category is generally used for employees at the rank of Captain and above and their civilian equivalents.

Professional Development: This category of disbursements includes courses that enhance, develop, and update the expertise of all Department employees and includes discretionary executive development courses, equipment, and facility rental.

Tuition Reimbursement: This category is for the reimbursement of tuition expenditures for Department personnel who attend certificate and degree programs presented by various accredited colleges. The program is open to all full-time Department personnel.

An opportunity for public comment was held. After further discussion of the matter, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations of the Board of Police Commissioners contained in the report, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its

consideration.
