Born on December 1, 1944, Apostle William T. Broadous was a resilient and committed community leader who supported many community organizations including but not limited to: the San Fernando Valley Branch of the NAACP, Boys and Girls Club of the San Fernando Valley, Pacoima Community Youth Cultural Center, San Fernando Valley Interfaith Council and the Alicia Broadous-Duncan Multi-purpose Senior Center. The lives of Apostle William T. Broadous' and his wife, Prophetess Gloria, were ones of service. Both had been involved in local, State, National and International Ministries with a specific calling to conduct Revival/Seminars on the Continent of Africa while caring and seeing to the needs of the people.

Apostle Broadous followed his late parent's footsteps and complemented his education by seeking God's guidance. He attended Bishop College and Dallas Theological Seminary. Apostle Broadous then served as a Director of the West Dallas Community Center, Martin Luther King Centers, the George Loving, Edgar Ward, and Joseph Macmillan Community Centers of West Dallas where he counseled youth seeking spiritual guidance.

While in Dallas, he met and married Gloria Lynnette Sneed-Taylor of Greater Memorial Missionary Baptist Church. With the company of his wife Gloria, Apostle Broadous traveled the great African continent to spread Christianity. They held seminars in the countries of Uganda, Zimbabwe, and South Africa. Together, Apostle William T. and Prophetess Gloria L. Broadous spent restless hours finding ways to help the community and spread the message of service, integrity, and love.

On February 4, 1980, Apostle William and Gloria Broadous joined the Calvary Baptist Church of Pacoima after being invited by his father, Rev. Dr. Hillary T. Broadous, the founder of the church, to serve under his tutelage as Assistant Pastor. Here, he continued his passion of serving, counseling, teaching, and preaching to God's people. In 1982, Apostle William T. Broadous became the Senior Pastor and Overseer of Calvary Baptist church of Pacoima. As senior Pastor, Apostle Broadous established the Children's Church at Calvary, the Calvary Baptist Church Social Service Ministry, the Calvary Baptist Koinonia Bookstore, counseled numerous Pastors and Clergy, and counseled and ordained over 20 men and women to the Gospel ministry.

On May 14, 2016, Apostle William T. Broadous' passed away surrounded by family and loved ones. Although no longer with us, Apostle Broadous' accomplishments, legacy, community service and need to help and inspire others will continue through his teachings at the Calvary Baptist Church in Pacoima.




