


MOTION

El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historic Monument is home to the birthplace of the City of Los Angeles and features the City's oldest home, the City's first three story building, historic Olvera Street, and numerous museums. The historic park brings Mexican, Italian, and Chinese culture to 2 million visitors a year. Located at the corner of Main Street and Cesar Chavez Avenue, El Pueblo Parking Lot 2 serves as the main parking lot for the monument. As the City continues to support the infill and reimagining of downtown property, this parking lot should be considered as a potential site for development. Based on its popularity and convenience as a parking lot servicing El Pueblo, any such development must include at least as many parking spaces as are currently present at Lot 2 and should help bring more business to the monument. In order to determine the best use of this site, the City Administrative Officer should release a Request for Proposals to seek development ideas for improving Lot 2 at El Pueblo.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Administrative Officer, with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst and City Attorney, prepare and release a Request for Proposals to seek development ideas for improving Lot 2 at El Pueblo and report to Council with the results.
