

## MOTION

Council District 9 has many historical locations that are important to the History of African Americans in the South Los Angeles Community. It is important that we memorialize these historically significant establishments in recognition of their important contributions to the enduring history of South Los Angeles and the larger community that is the City of Los Angeles.

**I THEREFORE MOVE** that following four intersections along Central Avenue be dedicated to these institutions for their contributions to the City of Los Angeles.

- 2700 S. Central Avenue **27th Street Bakery** founded by Harry Patterson and his wife in the 1930's as a restaurant, it was converted into a bakery in 1956 and continues to be one of the longest running family owned business in South Los Angeles
- 4261 S. Central Avenue **Golden State Mutual** Life founded in 1925 to provide life insurance to African Americans living in Los Angeles who were previously unable to purchase life insurance.
- 4145 S. Central Avenue **Black Panthers HQ** Prior to becoming infamous for a daytime shootout with the Los Angeles Police Department, the Black Panthers HQ was known for providing hot meals to low income students whose families couldn't afford to provide breakfast.
- 5630 S. Central Avenue **The Original Snack Shack** serving up burgers and fries for more than 50 years and still going strong.

**I FURTHER MOVE** that the Department of Transportation be directed to erect permanent ceremonial sign(s) to this effect at the above locations.
