HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to a pledge of support for a minimum of 222 new units of supportive housing, funded by Proposition HHH for the period of July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2020 for a total of 3,330 City-wide supportive housing units over the three year period.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Resolution (Harris-Dawson - Wesson - Huizar, et al), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

1. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION of a pledge of support from every City Councilmember of a minimum of 222 new units of supportive housing in their respective districts, funded by Proposition HHH for the period of July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2020, for a total of at least 3,330 citywide supportive housing units over the three year period.
2. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Housing and Community Investment Department to prepare an annual report summarizing the awards of Prop HHH Funds including the number of permanent supportive housing and affordable housing units funded each year, and aggregate the total overall funding years disaggregated by the City Council.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

On March 7, 2018, the Homelessness and Poverty Committee considered Resolution (Harris-Dawson - Wesson - Huizar, et al) relative to a pledge of support for a minimum of 222 new units of supportive housing, funded by Proposition HHH for the period of July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2020 for a total of 3,330 City-wide supportive housing units over the three year period.
