

MOTION

First Congregational Church of Los Angeles was founded in 1867 and is the oldest Protestant church in continuous service in Los Angeles. The current English Gothic Revival-style cathedral style building, designed by Los Angeles' architects James Edward Allison & David Clark Allison, was completed in 1932. On March 15, 2002, the church was designated a Historic-Cultural Monument by the Los Angeles Cultural Heritage Commission.

In honor of the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles' 150th anniversary in June 2017 and in recognition of the church's historical and cultural significance, it is appropriate that the City name the intersection of West 6th Street and Commonwealth Avenue as "Congregational Square."

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council designate the intersection of West 6th Street and Commonwealth Avenue as "Congregational Square" and that the Department of Transportation be directed to erect permanent ceremonial sign(s) to this effect at this location.
