On November 6th, California voters will have the opportunity to vote on Proposition 6. If passed, this measure will repeal Senate Bill 1 and the corresponding state revenues designated for road repairs and public transportation. According the California Secretary of State, passage of Proposition 6 would result in "reduced ongoing revenues of \$5.1 billion from state fuel and vehicle taxes that mainly would have paid for highway and road maintenance and repairs, as well as transit programs." The adverse impact that this measure will have on the City of Los Angeles and our ongoing transportation projects will undoubtedly be very significant.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation and the office of the City Administrative Officer to report immediately to the Council on the impact to the City's transportation revenue should Proposition 6 pass, and the impact on any current and future transportation capital projects and programs.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Council REQUEST a representative from LA Metro to report to the Council on the impact to Metro's current projects and programs impacting the City of Los Angeles.
