

RESOLUTION

TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 22507 authorizes cities to restrict the parking of vehicles, including but not limited to vehicles that are six feet or more in height, on identified City streets during certain hours; and

WHEREAS, there is an increased problem with oversized vehicles parking on portions of Wilcox Avenue, Fountain Avenue, Cole Avenue and De Longpre in the Hollywood community, in the immediate vicinity of the Hollywood Police Station and Fire Department Station 27, which are often parked overnight and constrict travel lanes, thereby creating undesirable roadway conditions; and

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 22507 requires that with the exception of parking restrictions in alleys, a resolution that restricts the parking of vehicles, including but not limited to six feet or more in height, during all or certain hours of the day, will only apply in areas in which signs are posted giving notice of restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 22507, hereby prohibits the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., on both sides of:

- Wilcox Avenue between Fountain Avenue and De Longpre Avenue
- Fountain Avenue between Wilcox Avenue and Cahuenga Boulevard
- Cole Avenue between Fountain Avenue and Cahuenga Boulevard
- De Longpre Avenue between Cahuenga Boulevard and Wilcox Avenue

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the adoption of the Resolution, the Department of Transportation be directed to post signs giving notice of the above restriction for oversized vehicles, with those specific hours detailed, on the street segments noted above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation be authorized to make any technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

Dear Councilmember Ryu,

On behalf of Hollywood area, I am writing to you regarding public safety issues in my community.

On a regular basis, we are experiencing problems related to oversized vehicles (Recreational Vehicles, campers, etc.) that have begun to regularly park in the neighborhood. Some of the problems related to the vehicles are trash accumulation, human waste, resident complaints regarding parking conditions, 72 hour violations, and radio calls regarding noise complaints associated with generators. These issues present public health and safety concerns and directly affect the quality of life for the residents and business owners in the area.

In addition, Police and Fire Personnel currently experience difficulties during peak traffic hours with ingress and egress from the police and fire stations. My concern with the oversized vehicles parking on either side of the street is the potential for a situation where vehicular traffic will be unable to pull to the right to clear a center lane for emergency response. As you are aware, minutes can matter in certain critical emergency situations.

To help deal with these issues, I request that No Parking restrictions be established for oversized vehicles excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height for the following streets in my area;

- Wilcox Avenue between Fountain Avenue and De Longpre Avenue
- Fountain Avenue between Wilcox Avenue and Cahuenga Boulevard
- Cole Place between Fountain Avenue and Cahuenga Boulevard
- De Longpre Avenue between Cahuenga Boulevard and Wilcox Avenue
