

MOTION

Chabad of Westwood owns the property at 741 Gayley Avenue in Council District 5 and uses it as a Community Center. The building includes a large industrial kitchen. The owners of the building, along with the Council Office, would like to rehabilitate the kitchen to operate a food service training program.


The program would train low income youths and adults on various food services vocations. The food that is produced through the program would then be distributed to homeless individuals. Renovating the kitchen would serve a dual purpose of providing food service training and providing meal services to homeless individuals.

In order to begin program operations, the organization is in need of approximately \$300,000 to rehabilitate the kitchen. Currently there are three sources of funds which may be used for this project. These options include the Homeless Services Program in the Unappropriated Balance in the 2018-19 Budget; the State Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP), and the Community Development Block Grant.

In order to assist Chabad of Westwood to renovate their kitchen and begin the training and food program, the Council should instruct the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) and City Administrative Officer (CAO) to review the funding sources and identify funds to assist Chabad with renovations.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council instruct the CLA and CAO to identify a funding source of approximately \$300,000 for the kitchen renovation and food training program located at 741 Gayley Avenue (Chabad of Westwood) from following funding sources, Homeless Services Program line item in the Unappropriated Balance, State HEAP grant funds, and Community Development Block Grant; and report to Council with recommendations.
