

RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE
REPORT relative to the closure of City streets for the Herbalife 24 Triathlon Los Angeles on
June 2, 2019.

Recommendation for Council action, as initiated by Resolution (Wesson - Price):

ADOPT the accompanying revised RESOLUTION supporting the use of Venice Beach for
portions of the Herbalife 24 Triathlon Los Angeles, and the closure of specific City streets for the
Herbalife 24 Triathlon Los Angeles on June 2, 2019, subject to conditions and payment of
applicable City services and permit fees.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst
has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on December 11, 2018, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental
Relations Committee considered Resolution (Wesson - Price) relative to the closure of City
streets for the Herbalife 24 Triathlon Los Angeles on June 2, 2019.


The Resolution states that the Herbalife 24 Triathlon Los Angeles is a race that will occur on the
streets of Los Angeles and begin in Venice and end in Downtown Los Angeles. The race is
expected to draw 5,000 participants and spectators. Herbalife Nutrition, the sponsor of the race,
will be submitting application to the applicable City departments for permission to close City
streets for the duration of the event, which the Resolution supports.

During consideration of this matter, a revised Resolution was submitted that provides additional
detail, such as the streets to be closed, the types of street closures, and approximate times of
the closures. Additionally, the revised Resolution states that the event will support programs at
the Union Rescue Mission.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council
adopt the revised Resolution. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
