

RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to establishing the City's position regarding Senate Bill (S.) 2062 (Manchin) which would prohibit the use of Federal funds to support the 2026 World Cup unless the United States Soccer Federation provides equitable pay to the United States Women's National Team and the United States Men's National Team.

Recommendation for Council action, as initiated by Resolution (Ryu – Martinez – Wesson – Rodriguez), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2019-20 Federal Legislative Program, SUPPORT for S. 2062 (Manchin) which would prohibit the use of Federal funds to support the 2026 World Cup unless the United States Soccer Federation provides equitable pay to the United States Women's National Team and the United States Men's National Team.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on November 15, 2019, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a CLA report dated November 13, 2019 and Resolution (Ryu – Martinez – Wesson – Rodriguez) relative to establishing the City's position regarding S. 2062 (Manchin) which would prohibit the use of Federal funds to support the 2026 World Cup unless the United States Soccer Federation provides equitable pay to the United States Women's National Team and the United States Men's National Team. The CLA report, attached to the Council file, provides additional background and a summary of the Resolution.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council adopt the CLA report and Resolution. This matter is now forwarded to Council for its consideration.
