

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to creating a bike path segment linking the Arroyo Channel bike path in the City of Los Angeles to the Arroyo Seco Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Huizar – Blumenfield):

1. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to develop a plan for the construction of a bike path segment that would link the Arroyo Channel bike path in the City of Los Angeles to the Arroyo Seco Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail.
2. INSTRUCT the Bureau of Engineering to acquire the necessary property rights to complete this bike path segment project.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.


SUMMARY

On January 15, 2019, Council considered Motion (Huizar – Blumenfield) relative to creating a bike path segment linking the Arroyo Channel bike path in the City of Los Angeles to the Arroyo Seco Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail. On October 18, 2018, South Pasadena opened the Arroyo Seco Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail, which connects to two of Pasadena's bicycle paths and is a short distance horn access to the Arroyo Seco Bike Path in the City of Los Angeles. Motion states that in order to connect the entire bike path, a small connecting segment must be constructed. Motion recommends that Council instruct LADOT to develop a plan to connect the trails, and for the City Engineer to acquire the property necessary to construct the project. Council referred Motion to the Transportation Committee for consideration.

At its meeting held March 27, 2019, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council approve Motion's recommendations.
