Summary: Updated Community Impact Statement Be it resolved that the Reseda Neighborhood Council is changing their official position regarding Council File 19-0192 which initiated a study on the feasibility of converting one or more of the Public Parking lots in Reseda to Affordable or Bridge Housing Whereas, the successful revitalization of the downtown Reseda Business District will rely heavily upon the continued existence of sufficient Public Parking Facilities to service a vibrant small business community, Whereas, the overwhelming opinion of the stakeholders of Reseda is that the Public Parking lots of Reseda should ONLY be improved as Public Parking lots and not converted to any other use, Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council recognizes the Public Parking Lots of Reseda are an extremely valuable asset that, once divested, can never be regained, Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council believes that any study contemplating using the Public Parking of Reseda is unnecessarily narrow in scope and unfairly targets the community of Reseda to the exclusion of many other viable alternates, Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council has made many efforts to engage with the CD3 office to come up with alternate solutions but has received inadequate cooperation from the CD3 office, Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council has received no response to specific concerns brought up by our stakeholders in the letter sent on December 9, 2019 and, Whereas, inadequate effort has been made to accommodate the conditions specified in the Reseda Neighborhood Council's original conditional approval, Now, therefore, it be resolved that the Reseda Neighborhood Council, and the stakeholders it represents, stands in opposition to Council File 19-0192, and believes that any study produced by this Council File Resolution is faulty on its face.

Re: Reseda Parking Lots Feasibility Study and Economic
Analysis

Dear Honorable Councilmember Bob Blumenfield:

We would like to start by thanking you for taking the time to send us the letter dated November 18th. We would also like it to be known that we appreciate that, once it was brought up by the stakeholders of Reseda as a concern, you agreed to add an Economic Impact Analysis to the Feasibility study created by your Council File 19-0192 Motion.

However, the letter supplied does not address the concerns Reseda stakeholders have that their community is being targeted without alternative solutions being considered. It seems to our stakeholders that the only consideration taken into account when you formulated your motion was which lot is the biggest and easiest target to go after. Absolutely no consideration was given to how vital to the continued health and future growth of the Reseda business community these Public Parking lots are, particularly in the precise location where this parking is currently supplied. It does nothing for the causes of transparency and credibility to continually repeat that we need to do a feasibility study on the lots in Reseda; and then claim neither the lots in Woodland Hills nor Canoga Park are viable, as if feasible and viable are not synonymous terms. If our goals are to assist in the current housing crisis, to do so in the least negatively impactful manner possible, and to determine, which, if any, of the Public Parking lots in CD3 might be appropriate for this, and in what manner, then clearly, we would need to do studies on the lots in Canoga Park and Woodland Hills (and not just Reseda) as well before declaring them not viable. But, to date, no such studies have been produced to substantiate these declarations of non-viability.

Various stakeholders have gone to look at these other Parking Lots and found them to be quite viable, actually having characteristics that make them even more attractive to use than the lots in Reseda. It is important to note that every Public Parking Lot in Canoga Park and Woodland Hills is in close proximity to at least one, and usually two, Major Transit Hubs. This would allow for special Transit Oriented and Affordable Housing Development Incentives that would reduce the new parking spaces required to be built for the project by potentially 75%. Should SB50 pass the State Assembly, the required parking could be reduced to almost none. This also makes these locations more valuable to the future residents of these Affordable HOusing Projects as they will have easy access to Public Transportation. None of the Public Parking Lots in Reseda are close to a major Transit Hub, and as a result, will not benefit from these Parking Reductions that make affordable housing

projects more viable, and would make getting around the city of LA much more difficult for the residents of any potential buildings built on the Reseda Public Parking Lots. It is also important to note that, unlike the Public Parking Lots in Reseda, the majority of which see regular usage in excess of 85%, the Public Parking lots in Canoga Park rarely see usage over 50%, as documented in the Reseda and Canoga Park Parking Utilization Studies of February, 2019. In addition, the duration of stay in Reseda Public Parking lots is 30% less than the duration of stay in Canoga Park lots. This means that Reseda Public Parking lots have a higher turnover rate, and are bringing more people and customers to the businesses of Reseda than the Public Parking lots in Canoga Park bring to businesses there. That makes the Public Parking lots in Reseda a much more dear and valuable commodity to Reseda, than Public Parking lots are to Canoga Park. Especially considering the significant blight the commercial center of Reseda has suffered for almost a decade now because of the dissolution of the California Redevelopment Agencies just as Reseda was in the pipeline for redevelopment funds.

Yet, when the RFB issued by the city of LA was released on 09/18/2019 the following LADOT lots located within Council District 3 were excluded from the study, one of which, by virtue of the amended Council File, was required to be included. This Council's support for Council File 19-0192 was conditioned upon the feasibility of every Public Parking Lot in CD3 being studied. We will require more than a statement that the other lots aren't "viable" to satisfy our stakeholders who have requested this council to remove any support for council file 19-0192 at this time.

LADOT lot #705 in Woodland Hills located at 5379 Don Pio is 15,873 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that replacement parking could be built on site. Considering Transit Hub parking Reductions, it is conceivable that Public Parking Space inventory could actually be increased with two levels of parking created with two to three levels of affordable residential above. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #676 in Canoga Park located at 7220 Jordan is 10,993 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that replacement parking could be built on site taking into account Transit Hub Parking Reductions. Any shortfalls in replacement parking on site can easily be absorbed by improvements to LADOT lot #704. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #704 in Canoga Park located at 7134 Jordan is 15,000 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that replacement parking could be built on site. Considering Transit Hub parking Reductions, it is conceivable that Public Parking Space inventory could actually be increased with two levels of parking created with two to three levels of affordable residential above. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #644 in Canoga Park located at 7233 Remmett is 7248 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that still allows for a multi story Affordable Housing Building to be constructed above on- grade replacement parking taking into account Transit Hub Parking Reductions. Any shortfalls in replacement parking on site can easily be absorbed by improvements to LADOT lot #676. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #618 in Canoga Park located at 7134 Remmett is 7449 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that still allows for a multi story Affordable Housing Building to be constructed above on- grade replacement parking taking into account Transit Hub Parking Reductions. Any shortfalls in replacement parking on site can easily be absorbed by improvements to LADOT lot #704. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #687 in Canoga Park located at 7141 Remmett is 7243 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that still allows for a multi story Affordable Housing Building to be constructed above on- grade replacement parking taking into account Transit Hub Parking Reductions. Any shortfalls in replacement parking on site can easily be absorbed by improvements to LADOT lot #704. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #725 in Canoga Park located at 7117 Remmett is 7500 square feet in size. It is of a size and configuration that still allows for a multi story Affordable Housing Building to be constructed above on- grade replacement parking taking into account Transit Hub Parking Reductions. Any shortfalls in replacement parking on site can easily be absorbed by improvements to LADOT lot #704. If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

LADOT lot #640 in Reseda located at 7130 Darby has a lot size of 49,005 square feet. Other uses are taking place upon it than just parking. Still, the portion dedicated to parking is of a size and configuration that would allow for a multi story Affordable Housing Building to be constructed above on-grade parking. Replacement parking can easily be handled by improvements to LADOT lot #622. If the entire lot could be utilized, Replacement Parking could easily be constructed on-site. . If any city agency has made a determination that this lot is not viable, we would like to have a statement in writing from the city agency and the staff person responsible for the determination. This statement should delineate the reasons that led to this determination and include any supporting documentation that justifies the conclusion.

We would appreciate the requested written statements be supplied to us within 30 days of receipt of this letter. In closing, we would like to thank you for diligently representing the interests of your constituents in Reseda, and we look forward to receiving the documentation requested.

DONE Representative Serrano informed the committee regarding the two additional youth seats. City Council File 18-0467 standardized the age of youth member seats to be 14-17 years of age, and limited to one representative. Commission decided to postpone the item to Monday. Department needs to submit a report by Wednesday. The Commission postponed to June 22<sup>nd</sup>. They noted that the existing youth seat is for ages 15-17. The recommendation is to amend this to reflect the 14-17 years of age. RNC's current amendment would be amended to reflect the change in age. Second, the additional proposed youth seat that was proposed will be eliminated, since it is not in conformity with the ordinance. Third, the third proposed youth seat for ages 18-20 can remain since it doesn't conform with the minor age restriction. However, this seat should be renamed to something such as Student (between 18 and 20) or some other title.

Public Comment (Glenn Bailey): Recommended focusing on the changing of the name for the youth seat. Could be Young Adult seat, which would not require being a student.

Councilmember Frank agreed with Glenn.

Councilmember Brewer inquired if changing the Youth Seat to a Young Adult Seat.

RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS - For information on the NC’s process for board action reconsideration, stakeholder grievance policy, or any other procedural matters related to this Council, please consult the NC Bylaws cited below.

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PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION (Article VIII§4):

The Board may reconsider or amend its actions through the following Motion for Reconsideration process:

- A. Before the Board reconsiders any matter, the Board must approve a Motion for Reconsideration by official action. After determining that an action should be reconsidered, the Board has the authority to re-hear, continue, or act on the item that is the subject of reconsideration.
- B. The Motion for Reconsideration must be brought, and the Board's approval of a Motion for Reconsideration must occur, either during the same meeting where the Board initially acted or during the Board's next regularly scheduled meeting that follows the meeting where the action subject to consideration occurred. The RNC may also convene a special meeting within these specified time frames to address a Motion for Reconsideration.
- C. A Motion for Reconsideration may be proposed only by a member of the Board that previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action that was taken by the Board (the "Moving Board Member").
- D. The Moving Board Member may make the Motion for Reconsideration orally during the same meeting where the action that is the subject of reconsideration occurred, or by properly placing the Motion for Reconsideration on the agenda of a meeting that occurs within the allowed specified periods of time as stated above.
- E. In order to properly place the Motion for Reconsideration on the agenda of the subsequent meeting, the Moving Board Member shall submit a memorandum to the Secretary at least two (2) days in advance of the deadline for posting notices for the meeting. The memorandum must briefly state the reason(s) for requesting the reconsideration and provide the Secretary with an adequate description of the matter(s) to be re-heard and the proposed action that may be adopted by the Board if the Motion for Reconsideration is approved.
- F. A Motion for Reconsideration that is properly brought before the Board may be seconded by any member of the Board.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE (Article XI):

- A. Any grievance by a Stakeholder or Board member must be submitted in writing to the Secretary who shall cause the matter to be placed on the agenda for the next regular RNC meeting, but in any case, no more than in thirty-five (35) days. The Neighborhood Council will follow the City's policy and/or rules regarding the handling of grievances. The Motion for Reconsideration must be brought, and the Board's approval of a Motion for Reconsideration must occur, either during the same meeting where the Board initially acted or during the Board's next regularly scheduled meeting that follows the meeting where the action subject to consideration occurred. The RNC may also convene a special meeting within these specified time frames to address a Motion for Reconsideration.
- B. At that meeting, the Board shall refer the matter to an Ad Hoc Grievance Panel comprised of three (3) Non-Board Stakeholders randomly selected by the Secretary from a list of Non-Board Stakeholders who have expressed an interest in serving from time-to-time on such a panel. The Moving Board Member may make the Motion for Reconsideration orally during the same meeting where the action that is the subject of reconsideration occurred, or by properly placing the Motion for Reconsideration on the agenda of a meeting that occurs within the allowed specified periods of time as stated above.
- C. Within two (2) weeks of the panel's selection, the Secretary shall coordinate a time and place for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved. A Motion for Reconsideration that is properly brought before the Board may be seconded by any member of the Board.
- D. Within two (2) weeks following such meeting, a member of the panel shall prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations 17 Approved 06-27-2017 prior to a Board meeting, but, in accordance with the Brown Act, the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until it is heard publicly at the next regular RNC meeting.
- E. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, such as the Board's failure to comply with Board Rules or these Bylaws. It is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who merely disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings, which grievances may be aired publicly at RNC meetings.
- F. The Neighborhood Council grievance review process will be conducted pursuant to any and all City ordinances, policies and procedures pertaining to Neighborhood Council grievances.



Updated Community Impact Statement

Be it resolved that the Reseda Neighborhood Council is changing their official position regarding Council File 19-0192 which initiated a study on the feasibility of converting one or more of the Public Parking lots in Reseda to Affordable or Bridge Housing

Whereas, the successful revitalization of the downtown Reseda Business District will rely heavily upon the continued existence of sufficient Public Parking Facilities to service a vibrant small business community,

Whereas, the overwhelming opinion of the stakeholders of Reseda is that the Public Parking lots of Reseda should ONLY be improved as Public Parking lots and not converted to any other use,

Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council recognizes the Public Parking Lots of Reseda are an extremely valuable asset that, once divested, can never be regained,

Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council believes that any study contemplating using the Public Parking of Reseda is unnecessarily narrow in scope and unfairly targets the community of Reseda to the exclusion of many other viable alternates,

Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council has made many efforts to engage with the CD3 office to come up with alternate solutions but has received inadequate cooperation from the CD3 office,

Whereas, the Reseda Neighborhood Council has received no response to specific concerns brought up by our stakeholders in the letter sent on December 9, 2019 and,

Whereas, inadequate effort has been made to accommodate the conditions specified in the Reseda Neighborhood Council's original conditional approval,

Now, therefore, it be resolved that the Reseda Neighborhood Council, and the stakeholders it represents, stands in opposition to Council File 19-0192, and believes that any study produced by this Council File Resolution is faulty on its face.
