

MOTION


The Police Department (LAPD) maintains facilities across the City, built over many years and in various states of repair. Some, such as LAPD's Rampart Station and Northeast Station, are relatively new, and were built through Proposition Q, a voter-approved Public Safety Bond Measure which was approved by the voters in 2002. Proposition Q allowed the City to construct a number of Police Stations and renovate other facilities, and the City has been very successful in delivering Proposition Q-funded projects.

However, Proposition Q is set to end in 2022, and despite the City's ability to deliver additional projects through cost savings found in the construction of LAPD facilities through this Bond Measure, there are still a number of LAPD facilities that are in need of replacement or significant repairs. The City should build upon the success of Proposition Q by asking the voters to approve a new Public Safety Bond Measure.


I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Administrative Officer, with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst, City Attorney, Bureau of Engineering and Police Department (LAPD), be requested to prepare and present the necessary documents to place a Public Safety Facilities Bond Measure before the voters at the next available opportunity, to go into effect when the existing Bond Program is completely paid for.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Bureau of Engineering, with the assistance of LAPD, evaluate the LAPD's facilities needs in order to identify which projects should be prioritized in a Public Safety Facilities Bond Measure, and the approximate funding needs.


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
