Summary: The Hollywood United Neighborhood Council agrees with the council file assessment that the current Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) categories do a poor job of allocating housing to those who need it and that the city is failing to meet its own identified need of affordable housing. One specific way that the categories do not identify need is for renters who fall into the "Moderate Income" and "Below Moderate Income" categories, who make too much to qualify for scarce affordable housing, yet still find themselves significantly burdened by the very high market rate rents in Los Angeles. Rent in Hollywood is especially high relative to other parts of Los Angeles. Therefore, HUNC supports the council file's instruction for the city to review the number of people fitting this category, the current housing stock available to them, and programs used in other municipalities to increase housing stock to meet their needs.
