


MOTION

Mulholland Drive from Saltillo Road eastward to Trinidad Road is a dirt roadway with no engineered improvements such as structural pavement, drainage, curb and gutter, etc. that satisfy Public Works standards. During summer months residents often complain of dust. During the rainy season short sections of the road can become impassable to some vehicles due to muddy conditions. Because of the dirt surface condition, the only form of maintenance available to the Bureau of Street Services (StreetsLA) has been to periodically smooth the road surface. As the only public entity with open space lands that abut the subject section of dirt Mulholland Drive, the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) strongly favors that this section remain scenic and rural to protect the natural environment.

It is critical that the City identify a long-term solution for subject section of "Dirt" Mulholland Drive" through a collaborative effort with the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority. Options include non-paving solutions and alternative green technologies such as dust suppression, decomposed granite, drainage culverts, water capture basins, and/or other alternative materials. The MRCA should be a partner with the City for ongoing maintenance with responsibilities outlined in a memorandum of agreement (MOA).

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Bureau of Street Services (StreetsLA) with the assistance of the Bureau of Engineering report back with "all purpose" incremental mitigation recommendations to suppress dust, alleviate rutting, and provide limited control of drainage, and erosion in critical areas, while preserving the rural ambience.
