

MOTION

The City of Los Angeles and the state of California's homelessness crisis demands immediate and comprehensive solutions that treats this issue as the dire emergency that it is. With more than 58,000 homeless individuals living in Los Angeles County and more than 36,000 in the City of Los Angeles, we must approach this crisis from all fronts.

A key part of the City of Los Angeles's homelessness strategy has been using government-owned properties for projects that help address the homelessness crisis. This year, California's state legislature took action to make properties owned or controlled by the state available.

SB 211 authorizes Caltrans to lease its property to local governments for the purpose of an emergency shelter or feeding program for \$1 per month plus administrative fees.

AB 761 allows, at the sole discretion of the Adjutant General (TAG), the use of any armory deemed vacant by the California Military Department throughout the year by the county or city in which the armory is located for the purpose of providing temporary shelter from hazardous weather conditions for homeless persons.

The City should expeditiously take advantage of the opportunities created by this legislation.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Chief Legislative Analyst, in consultation with relevant City and state agencies, be directed to report with a full inventory of all properties made eligible or potentially eligible for homeless housing and services in the City of Los Angeles by SB211 and AB761.
