Summary: The Central Hollywood Neighborhood Council SUPPORTS the motion by CMs Bonin and Harris-Dawson to have LAHSA report on the efficacy of current programs in serving unhoused people of varying acuity levels. Over 560 of CHNC's stakeholders are homeless; over 450 have no shelter at all. Our area is serviced by a wealth of providers and sees regular LAHSA activity due to the Schrader Bridge Home's SECZ. Nevertheless, unsheltered homelessness in our borders rose 6% over 2019 compared to 1% in SPA4 generally. Indeed, fully 3 out of every 100 people we serve have no housing. It is thus critical that CHNC understands how many of each of these stakeholders has what level of need, and how the relevant City and County programs are performing in addressing them. Only then can we responsibly and effectively link our stakeholders to the correct services and provide them with the help they need to get and stay off the streets.

The Central Hollywood Neighborhood Council (CHNC) **SUPPORTS** the 11 December 2019 motion by CMs Bonin and Harris-Dawson to have the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) report on the efficacy of current programs in serving unhoused people of varying acuity levels.

Over 560 of CHNC's stakeholders are homeless, with over 450 having no shelter at all.¹ Our area is serviced by a wealth of providers and sees regular LAHSA activity due to the Special Cleaning and Enforcement Zone accompanying the Schrader Bridge Home. Nevertheless, unsheltered homelessness in our borders rose 6% over 2019 as compared to 1% in SPA-4 writ large.² Indeed, **fully 3 out of every 100 people we serve have no housing.** CHNC therefore finds it critical to understand how many of each of these stakeholders has what level of need, and how the relevant City and County programs aimed at serving those stakeholders are performing.

Of special interest to CHNC are data pertaining to:

1. how many people of each acuity level have been moved into housing of any kind (bridge, permanent supportive, rapid rehousing, etc.);
2. the change in individual acuity scores over time/the correlation between acuity score and time spent unhoused.

Only with such knowledge can CHNC responsibly and effectively link our stakeholders to the right services and provide them with the help they need to get and stay off the streets.
