Summary: Support of City Council's Motion to Oppose SB 1120 Whereas State Senate Bill 1120: 1) would eliminate public hearings and public notice and only require administrative, ministerial review; 2) would provide ministerial approval of a parcel map of four or fewer parcels; 3) would undermine the Subdivision Map Act which now vests the authority to regulate and control the design and improvement of subdivisions by the legislative body of a local agency; 4) would exempt projects from environmental review, undermining community participation and vetting by local legislative bodies; 5) would override local zoning, in effect eliminating single-family zoning in the city and statewide; 6) would disregard the zoning limitations that homeowners statewide relied upon when making their home purchase decision; 7) would reduce parking requirements and eliminate parking within ½ mile of transit; and 8) would not require that any of the units created be affordable and so fails to address the City's and the State's most pressing need for low and very low income housing.
