

MOTION

ENERGY, CLIMATE CHANGE, AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

On March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted motion 72P, (Bonin - Harris-Dawson - Cedillo), CF 20-0147), resulting in the suspension of Sanitation CARE+ Comprehensive cleaning citywide.

On July 29, 2020, the City Council adopted motion (Buscaino-Krekorian, CF 20-0147), and instructed LA Sanitation and Environment (LASAN) to resume CARE+ Comprehensive cleaning in A Bridge Home (ABH) Special Enforcement Cleaning Zones (SECZ) only.

Several major homeless encampments in Council District 15, outside of ABH SECZs, have gone months without comprehensive cleaning, and are in dire need of immediate sanitary services. Conditions are so bad in one encampment that homeless outreach workers have ceased visiting unhoused residents.

Health risks associated with poor sanitary conditions include a multitude of illnesses and diseases, for example dysentery, hepatitis A, typhus, tuberculosis, and infection by the norovirus.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council Action of March 17, 2020 (CF# 20-0147, as amended by motion 72-P and motion 72-P-A), relative to suspending comprehensive CARE+ cleanups, be AMENDED to AUTHORIZE the Bureau of Sanitation to resume CARE+ cleanups in Council District 15 at the following locations:

- W 253rd Street and McCoy Avenue
- Figueroa Avenue and West E Street
- South Beacon Street and Gulch Road
