**RE: COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT - PILOT STORAGE PROGRAM /  
INTERIM HOUSING RESIDENTS / COUNCIL DISTRICT THREE (CF 21-0316)**

On May 4, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held with a quorum of 14 board members present and that by a vote of 14 yes, 0 no, and 0 abstentions, the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNC) adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning [CF 20-0316](#).

Unhoused individuals and families' belongings are necessary and special to them. When they are offered opportunities to relocate to interim housing, they are asked to separate items that they absolutely need, pare down the number of possessions they bring to the housing development, and are told the remainder will be placed in storage at a downtown facility that the individual can reclaim later. Quite often those possessions are lost or not reclaimed due to difficulty accessing the storage site. As a result, unhoused individuals may not want to part with their valuables, possessions and items that they need, so they may forego housing in order to store their possessions in their vehicle, tent or at a makeshift shelter.

This [Motion](#) requests that outreach workers and service providers assist individuals and families to manage their belongings which should be part of the intake process. The Motion also requests that LAHSA and LASAN work with local service providers to develop a pilot storage program where residents who are being relocated to interim housing can store their excess belongings to ensure a smooth transition from the street into temporary housing. It goes on to request the CAO and CLA to identify funding sources and contract amendments to implement such a program.
