**Resolution in Support of CF 20-0690**

**Black Lives Matter.** The Sherman Oaks Neighborhood Council (SONC) agrees with the Los Angeles City Council’s proposed Resolution pertaining to the circumstances of “murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Minnesota on May 25, 2020,” and the “national outpouring of anguish, anger and introspection on issues of race and policing, among other issues.” Despite the subsequent arrests of Derek Chauvin, Thomas Lane, JA Keung, and Tou Thao in accordance with CF 20-0690, SONC nonetheless urges the City Council to adopt its Resolution in some form, and specifically the aforementioned language pertaining to “murder,” “anguish, anger and introspection on issues of race and policing,” and unconditional condemnation of “the murder in the strongest possible terms.” SONC also implores the City Council to adopt the language, “Black Lives Matter.” Be it resolved that SONC shall communicate its position through the issuance of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) on CF 20-0690 and through a letter to the Councilmember for District Four, David Ryu, who seconded the original motion CF 20-0690.
