Summary: The Central Hollywood Neighborhood Council SUPPORTS the 22 September 2020 motion by CMs O'Farrell et al. to have the relevant City entities review the delivery of health, mental health, and social services by LA County to LA City's unsheltered residents, including by holding hearings.

The Central Hollywood Neighborhood Council (CHNC) **SUPPORTS** the 22 September 2020 motion by CMs O’Farrell et al. to have the relevant City entities review the delivery of health, mental health, and social services by LA County to LA City’s unsheltered residents, including by holding hearings.

At least 560 CHNC residents are unhoused---1 in 30 people.¹ At least 450 of these stakeholders are unsheltered. We are an epicenter of homelessness in LA City, which is the epicenter of homelessness in LA County. We have affirmed that a state of emergency exists with respect to homelessness.² We believe that proper health and mental healthcare is critical both to the survival of unhoused Angelenos, and to keeping them stably housed once they get off the street.

LA City comprises roughly 40% of LA County’s total population, but 60% of its homeless population.³ As such, we must understand whether unhoused Angelenos are receiving County resources commensurate with that number adjusted for any differential in intrinsic need. If they are not receiving such care, that fact should be remedied as swiftly as possible.

We look forward to the results of the proposed hearings and are happy to assist with fact-finding in Central Hollywood if appropriate.
