Summary: Re: Council File #20-0841-S4, "Pallet Shelter / Tiny Home Village Program / Economical Alternatives" On January 27, 2021, the BABCNC held a Brown Act publicly noticed regular monthly board meeting and voted to SUPPORT Councilmembers Koretz's & Bonin's Resolution introduced on December 15, 2020, which asks that the City Administrative Officer (CAO), the Bureau of Engineering (BOE), the Department of Building and Safety and any other relevant departments and agencies be instructed to review the Pallet Shelter tiny home village program and develop alternatives which can bring the per unit cost down to the \$17,000-22,000 range; other California communities have been able to utilize the same equipment for in service of the same purpose; and further, that strategies such as reduced construction costs, alternative approaches to structural stability and safety, pared-down amenities, permit and fee waivers, and involvement of village residents in maintenance and operational tasks when feasible and appropriate, should be explored, among others, as part of this effort; and further that the CAO and BOE report back to the City Council in 30 days with recommendations for reducing the costs of these tiny home villages so that more Angelenos experiencing homelessness can be provided with shelter.
