

## MOTION

The Parks First Trust Fund provides funding for the purpose of acquiring land and developing, improving and maintaining parks and open space that are physically located within the boundaries of the Vermont/Western Station Neighborhood Area Plan (SNAP) area. The Vermont/Western SNAP was established in January 2001 by the City Council. SNAP covers an area of approximately 2.2 square miles within the Hollywood and Wilshire communities within Council District 4, 10, and 13.

Approximately \$3.2 million were made available for eligible projects through the 10<sup>th</sup> Funding Cycle Request for Proposals (RFP). The Department of Cultural Affairs has submitted a grant application to help complete the restoration of the Frank Lloyd Wright's Residence A project located in Barnsdall Park in Hollywood. With the completion of the Residence A project, youth and general audiences will have access to a national landmark structure, owned and interpreted by the City. Pursuant to the RFP, the grant proposal must include a Council motion committing to make the property available for the project.


