**RE: COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT (CF 20-1425) UNACCOMPANIED
HOMELESS WOMEN / DATA COLLECTION / ANNUAL POINT-IN-TIME COUNT**

On December 1, 2020, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held with a quorum of 12 board members present and that by a vote of 12 yes, 0 no, and 0 abstentions, the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNC) adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning [CF 20-1425](#).

This Motion (CF 20-1425) requests that LAHSA designate unaccompanied homeless women as a subpopulation and begin collecting information on race, gender, age, geography, sexual orientation, domestic violence/intimate partner violence status, etc. in the annual count and in other data collection systems. The Motion is also asking that the City Council instruct the Chief Legislative Analyst and City Administrator Office, LAHSA, Los Angeles County, the Downtown Women's Center, and other organizations to report back with recommendations on strategies and resources to assist and house unaccompanied homeless women.

The Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council supports this Motion and proposes that the report back period is expedited to 30 days, for the purpose of moving forward with assisting unaccompanied homeless women as quickly as possible.

As Amy Turk, CEO of the Downtown Women's Center [states](#):

- Women homelessness is a gender and racial equity issue
- Women homelessness in Los Angeles is growing at a faster rate than men's
- COVID-19-related job losses are disproportionately impacting women, as is domestic violence and evictions
- Unaccompanied women can access fewer resources and services than those with families.

As the City of Los Angeles rightfully recognized in [CF 20-0715](#), racism is a public health crisis. Sexism is also a public health crisis. Addressing the needs of unaccompanied homeless women with urgency is essential to restoring our city and its communities.
