**RE: COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT (CF 20-1475) 1201 SOUTH FIGUEROA
STREET / LOS ANGELES CONVENTION CENTER / TEMPORARY EMERGENCY
HOMELESS SHELTER / COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

On December 1, 2020, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held with a quorum of 12 board members present and that by a vote of 12 yes, 0 no, and 0 abstentions, the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNc) adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning [CF 20-1475](#).

This Motion (CF 20-1475) requests that the City evaluate the use of the Los Angeles Convention Center as a temporary emergency homeless shelter within 30 days.

The Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council supports this Motion and proposes that the City also evaluate other sites to serve as local winter shelters across the city.

According to [LAHSA's website](#), there are no winter shelters in Eagle Rock or in North East Los Angeles. As COVID-19 infections and job losses continue to climb, evictions are expected to rise significantly in the coming months. While we encourage the City and County to continue to invest in homelessness prevention, we recognize the importance of winter shelters, especially for the newly homeless. To be most helpful, winter shelters must be local.
