Comments for Public Posting: According to CA Penal Code 596.7, injuries and fatalities are supposed to be reported within 48 hours of the conclusion of rodeo. Facts: 1. There are major loopholes to reporting (i.e. injuries & deaths during practice sessions or "slack" do not have to be reported) 2. There is under-reporting. (Notably ABSENT from this batch of reports is the bull that was killed on 8.3.23 at the Orange County Fair) 3. There is zero enforcement. This useless penal code is the equivalent of the fox guarding the henhouse. 4. There is corruption. Example: the Salinas rodeo vet, Dr. Tim Eastman, is also the DIRECTOR of the rodeo. It is not entertaining to watch innocent farm animals getting roped, wrestled, wrangled, hog tied, strangled, slammed to the ground. Please support this ordinance. There are so many other things to do in our beautiful city.
