

RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to establishing the City's position in the 2021-22 Federal Legislative Program for House Resolution (H.R.) 501 (Barragan), the Climate Smart Ports Act, which would establish a \$1 billion per year grant program for the purchase of human-operated, clean energy infrastructure at ports and authorize an additional \$50 million a year for the Diesel Emissions Reduction Act Program to fund projects that reduce port emissions.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Buscaino - Krekorian), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2021-2022 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for H.R. 501, the Climate Smart Ports Act, which would establish a \$1 billion per year grant program for the purchase of human-operated, clean energy infrastructure at ports and authorize an additional \$50 million a year for the Diesel Emissions Reduction Act Program to fund projects that reduce port emissions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

SUMMARY:

At its regular meeting held on March 17, 2021, Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a Resolution (Buscaino - Krekorian), and CLA report dated March 11, 2021, attached to the Council file, relative to establishing the City's position in the 2021-22 Federal Legislative Program for H.R. 501 (Barragan), the Climate Smart Ports Act, which would establish a \$1 billion per year grant program for the purchase of human-operated, clean energy infrastructure at ports and authorize an additional \$50 million a year for the Diesel Emissions Reduction Act Program to fund projects that reduce port emissions.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee recommended that Council approve the recommendations in the Resolution and CLA report to include in the City's 2021-22 Federal Legislative Program support for H.R. 501.
