Summary: In order to help LAUSD meet its goal of the reopening of schools in an equitable and safe manner, the Los Feliz Neighborhood Council supports this resolution and efforts to reopen schools as safely as possible. The agreement between the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and the United Teachers of Los Angeles (UTLA) commits the City of Los Angeles to reopen schools for in person learning on April 9th. However, given the State's policy of rewarding schools for reopening on April 1st and greatly reducing the rewards following that date, LAUSD schools will not benefit from these early reopening rewards. Similarly, the number of vaccines available for LAUSD teachers allocated by FEMA (25,000) do not reach the threshold for vaccinations in the LAUSD-UTLA agreement (full vaccination). Simply put, reopening efforts are being put on hold or put at risk by the lack of State and FEMA funding being allocated to LAUSD teachers. This Neighborhood Council therefore urges the City Council to adopt this resolution, committing to supporting legislation that increases funding allocations from the County and FEMA to LAUSD educators, to ensure a safe and equitable reopening.
