

RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTIONS relative to establishing the City's position regarding the Tourism and the Los Angeles Convention Center 2021-22 Federal Legislative Program Proposals.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution, SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTIONS to include in the City's 2021-2022 Federal Legislative Program:

- a. SUPPORT or SPONSOR the Hospitality and Commerce Job Recovery Act of 2020, or any similar legislation that would include tax credits to support conventions and travel expenditures, and make improvements to the Employee Retention Tax Credit program (Attachment A of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) transmittal dated November 10, 2020, attached to the Council file).
- b. SUPPORT or SPONSOR legislation that would expand eligibility in the Paycheck Protection Program to include 501(c)(6) nonprofit entities, including destination marketing organizations (Attachment B of said CLA transmittal).
- c. SUPPORT or SPONSOR legislation that would provide Federal funding or grants for convention center expansion and modernization projects as regionally significant infrastructure (Attachment C of said CLA transmittal).

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the Chief Legislative Analyst nor the City Administrative Officer has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on December 2, 2020, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a Resolution and Chief Legislative Analyst report relative to establishing the City's position regarding the Tourism and the Los Angeles Convention Center 2021-22 Federal Legislative Program Proposals.
