On May 4, 2021, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held with a quorum of 14 board members present and that by a vote of 14 yes, 0 no, and 0 abstentions, the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNC) adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning [CF 21-0002-S71](#).

This Motion requests adoption of the Resolution in support of SB 678, which requires that counties provide data on unaccompanied women, set specific measurable goals aimed at preventing and ending homelessness among unaccompanied women in the State and defining outcome measures.
