By granting adequate bathroom access, these stations not only provide privacy and dignity to our unhoused residents, but also maintain neighborhood sanitation. Since the closure of Echo Park Lake at night, our community can benefit from a potential station at the lake to address the hygiene needs of the houseless in our neighborhood.
