DISCUSSION

This grant will fund the purchase of fifteen Internet Protocol surveillance cameras (IP cameras) and fifteen compatible wireless routers for Major Crimes Division. Surveillance cameras provide situational awareness to Incident Commanders at Department Command Posts and other high-profile incidents. They are also essential for criminal investigations and can even help deter criminal activity when used in a means visible to the public.

The few remaining surveillance cameras currently used by the Department are outdated in technology, rely on obsolete, irreplaceable wireless routers, and are nearing the end of their expected service life with no available firmware updates. Approval of this grant will modernize the Department's technology and ensure effective deployment of personnel and resources during various planned and unplanned events. In addition, the Department will benefit from greater success in surveilling criminal suspects and saving a substantial number of man-hours in criminal investigations.

The Los Angeles Police Foundation is an independent, not-for-profit organization that provides critical resources and vital support to the Los Angeles Police Department. The few remaining surveillance cameras used by the Department are outdated in terms of technology and rely on obsolete wireless routers which cannot be replaced. In addition, they are nearing their expected service life with no available firmware updates. The acquisition of new IP cameras along with wireless routers (which are required for IP Camera operation) will modernize the Department's technology and maximize its workforce by accomplishing what would otherwise require a substantial number of personnel.

What objectives will be accomplished if the funding is granted?

If funding is granted and fifteen IP cameras and wireless routers are purchased, Major Crimes Division and the Department will enhance their ability to provide situational awareness to Incident Commanders during planned and unplanned events involving crowds of people. The IP cameras will also be used for criminal investigations and save substantial man-hours.

How many officers will be impacted with this grant?

The entire Department will benefit when the IP cameras are used to provide situational awareness to Incident Commanders. Major Crimes Division and the Department overall will benefit when the IP cameras are used for criminal investigations.

How will the community be impacted by this grant?

The community will benefit when Incident Commanders are able to deploy personnel and resources during planned and unplanned events in such a way to have the least impact on uninvolved community members.

Describe the short-term outcome and long-term impact you anticipate within the Department and in the community it serves as result of this grant.

A greater success in surveilling criminal suspects translates into short-term and long-term enhancements in investigating suspects preying on the community. Also, the enhanced investigations will lessen the potential for unplanned confrontations with the suspect and associated consequences such a confrontation can have on the community. Additionally, these devices will greatly enhance situational awareness of IC's at Department Command Posts and other high-profile incidents.

How can the Foundation evaluate success if the funding is granted? (# of people served, objectives reached, surveys, etc.)

Major Crimes Division can supply data on when the IP cameras are used.



It is requested that Major Crimes Division be approved for a grant to purchase fifteen Internet Protocol surveillance cameras (IP cameras) along with fifteen compatible wireless routers. Both items must be purchased together as they are both essential for IP camera operation. Approval of this grant benefits the Department as follows:

Surveillance cameras provide situational awareness to Incident Commanders during planned special events as well as unplanned events involving crowds of people. In addition, they are utilized for criminal investigations. An additional and ancillary effect that surveillance cameras have produced is that when used in a means where they are visible to the general public, they have been a deterrent to criminal activity.

The few remaining surveillance cameras used by the Department are outdated in terms of technology and rely on obsolete wireless routers which cannot be replaced.
