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LETTER OF OPPOSITION FOR COUNCIL FILE 21-0600

The Echo Park Neighborhood Council requests that the 2021-2022 city budget include a participatory process so that stakeholders and constituents may contribute. Surveys have been done independently of the city, most recently The People's Budget, with tens of thousands of responses. Without an open and transparent budgeting process, City Council runs the risk of ignoring the demonstrable will of the people who wish to invest in Public Health and Healthcare, Housing Security, and Mental Health services while divesting from the City Attorney's Office, Police and Policing, and Parking Enforcement. Therefore the Echo Park Neighborhood Council requests that the creation process of the 2021-2022 city budget include multiple points of access to enfranchise stakeholders.

RESOLUTION

On May 26, 2021, the EPNC Board of Governors held a Brown Act noticed-meeting, at 7pm through zoom. With a quorum of 17 board members present and vote count of 17 yeas, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions, the Board resolved to write a letter of opposition for the application as set forth above.
