The Echo Park Neighborhood Council supports this motion to assist the new Citywide Street Engagement Strategy with increased flexible rental subsidies through a partnership between the City and the County.

This council specifically appreciates the emphasis on targeting those with particular health and mental health needs so that the most vulnerable are given the opportunity to transition from the streets into permanent housing solutions.

We reiterate our continued opposition to Special Enforcement Zones created by the recent updates to LAMC 41.18 but remain hopeful that proactive outreach, proper notice of sweeps, and increased permanent housing options will prevent future events similar to the Echo Park Lake Sweep of March 25, 2021.
