Furthermore, the government should not limit access to public or private buildings to only those who have chosen to vaccinate. Doing so is against our long held self evident rights as Americans.

To ignore and disregard a large portion of your constituents' grave concerns of being excluded from engaging in commerce and society based on vaccination status is denying their Constitutional Rights (the Supreme Law of the Land) , the Unruh Act, HIPPA Laws and The Nuremberg Code. Our rights, liberties, and protections are not to be stripped from the populace under any circumstance.

There are many questions on how this “building” mandate or any other machinations would or could be enforced. Law enforcement has been greatly defunded and it is against the very premise of good business for business owners to exclude certain populations, AKA discriminate.
