Summary: The Empowerment Congress North Area Neighborhood Development Council supports CF 21-0911 that: 1. the CLA, in consultation with City Attorney, report back to the Council on current protocols across City Departments to provide compensation to victims of city-caused accidents or disasters, including the LAPD fireworks detonation and the LASAN Hyperion sewage spill and 2. that the Office of Racial Equity within the Department of Civil and Human Rights and Equity report back to the City Council with an equity framework that can be used by all departments in providing victim compensation in the event of a city-caused accident or disaster. The city initiated a controlled detonation of illegal fireworks seized from a home on the 700 block of East 27th Street, caused widespread injuries in the area. Police estimated the weight at 16.5 pounds, but federal investigators later determined that the weight was closer to 42 pounds. The response to victims was lesser than demonstrated in other areas of the city in other incidents. The inadequacy of the care of victims on 27th Street raised issues of fairness and equity on how victims are treated in all areas of the city. As shown in the 27th Street incident, the same level of assistance and compensation has not been offered by city agencies in circumstances impacting less affluent communities and communities of color.
